Program Overview

The Forgotten Soldiers Outreach (FSO) Student Ambassador Program engages high school and college students across the nation to support U.S. troops deployed overseas through leadership, volunteer service, fundraising, and awareness campaigns. Ambassadors act as local champions of the FSO mission-ensuring no service member is forgotten.

Objectives

- Raise awareness about the needs of deployed service members
- Coordinate collection drives and fundraising events
- Recruit peers to support FSO efforts & Mission
- Submit monthly reports to track impact
- Create a ripple effect of patriotism, service, civic engagement and compassion

Eligibility

- High school students (Grades 9-12)
- College students (Undergraduate or Graduate)
- Make a commitment to positively represent FSO's mission and values.

Ambassador Tier System Overview

The FSO Student Ambassador Program is designed to recognize and reward the dedication and impact of our student volunteers. To ensure a clear path of growth and achievement, the program is structured into three tiers: Cadet, Advocate, and Patriot. Each tier represents an increased level of engagement and leadership, offering students meaningful opportunities to serve, lead, and inspire their communities while supporting deployed U.S. service members.

As ambassadors complete tasks such as organizing care package drives, hosting fundraisers, and promoting FSO's mission, they advance through these tiers—earning recognition, exclusive incentives, and valuable service experience along the way.

Tier 1: Cadet

Requirements:

- Attend FSO orientation (virtual or in-person)
- Share at least one approved FSO social media post
- Attend one virtual meeting or info session

Incentives:

- FSO Digital Badge
- Certificate of Participation

Tier 2: Advocate

Requirements:

- Lead or co-lead one fundraising event
 - A minimum of \$100 must be raised individually OR \$250 if working as a team.
- Host or contribute to one care package drive
- Recruit at least one new participant

Incentives:

- FSO Digital Ambassador Badge
- Custom FSO Notebook
- Printed Certificate of Appreciation (CoA)

Tier 3: Patriot

Requirements:

- Lead multiple events (including at least one fundraiser and a food drive or letter writing drive)
 - A minimum of \$300 must be raised individually OR
 \$450 if working as a team.
- Submit at least two monthly impact reports with photos and summaries.
- Collaborate with a school club or campus organization.
- Write five or more letters to be included in care packages.

Incentives:

- FSO Challenge Coin
- Spotlight on FSO Website/Social Media, highlighted in a monthly newsletter
- FSO Gift Bundle (T-shirt, Patch, Notebook)

Volunteer Status

- No ambassador or participant is entitled to wages, stipends, or other forms of compensation.
- Participation does not create an employment relationship with FSO or its affiliates.

Fundraising Expectations

- Students may be encouraged to take on leadership roles in fundraising events that support FSO's mission.
- There is no personal financial obligation to donate or guarantee fundraising amounts.
- All fundraising must be conducted in accordance with FSO guidelines and local laws.

Recognition & Awards

- Incentives (such as certificates, challenge coins, or digital badges) are provided as a form of recognition, not payment.
- Scholarship opportunities are subject to donor funding and availability and are not guaranteed.

Representation & Conduct

- Ambassadors are expected to positively represent the mission of Forgotten Soldiers Outreach in their communities.
- Public behavior, use of social media, and event participation must reflect the values of service, integrity, and respect.
- Misuse of the ambassador title or misrepresentation of affiliation may result in removal from the program.
